Financial situation of UNIDO

Report by the Director General

The present document provides information on the financial situation of the Organization as at 31 March 2015.

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I. Overview

1. The financial situation as at 31 March 2015 can be summarized in the following major points:

(a) Regular budget net expenditure for the first year of the biennium 2014-2015 amounted to €63.3 million in 2014, or 89.6 per cent of the approved 2014 net budget estimates. As at 31 March 2015, €82.7 million or 56.2 per cent of the gross biennial appropriation was spent;

(b) The operational budget expenditure amounted to €18.5 million in the reporting period;

(c) The expenditure level for buildings management amounted to €33.3 million in accordance with the prevailing workplan;

(d) The collection rate of 2015 assessed contributions at 31 March 2015 was 40.8 per cent, compared to the 2014 and 2013 rates of 36.8 and 38 per cent, respectively;

(e) The collection rate of prior years' arrears, as compared to the current year's assessments, was 3.6 per cent. The rate as at 31 March 2014 and 2013, as compared to the assessments of those years, was 1.2 and 10.2 per cent, respectively;

(f) Outstanding assessed contributions amounted to €140.4 million, as shown in the annex to the present document (including arrears of €69.1 million by the United States of America, and €2.1 million by the former Yugoslavia). The outstanding amounts as at 31 March 2014 and 2013 were €138.2 million and €138.9 million, respectively;

(g) The Working Capital Fund was at the level of €7,423,030. €150,620 was outstanding as at 31 March 2015;

(h) A conference room paper will be issued on the status of assessed contributions and voting rights, which will contain updated information.

II. Regular and operational budgets, 2014-2015

A. Regular budget

2. Allotments to the value of €63.5 million were issued in 2014, against which, by 31 December 2014, regular budget net expenditures amounted to €63.3 million. This amount corresponds to 89.6 per cent of the total approved net regular budget for 2014. In 2012, the first year of the preceding biennium, an implementation rate of 87.8 per cent was recorded.

3. At the onset of 2013, the second year of the biennium, further allotments to the value of €69.5 million were issued. This represents an initial release threshold by budget line and/or major object of expenditure to facilitate sufficient funding at the commencement of the second year and to ensure a smooth run of activities for each programme entity.

4. As at 31 March 2015, expenditures totalled €82.7 million, corresponding to 56.2 per cent of the gross biennial budget. These indicators are comparable with those of the previous biennium where, at 31 March 2013, expenditures amounted to €83.7 million, representing 53.0 per cent of the gross biennial budget.

B. Operational budget

5. Allotments of €13.7 million net of carried forward amounts were issued in 2014, in line with expected support cost reimbursement income. As at 31 December 2014, net expenditures amounted to €14.9 million, representing 92.6 per cent of the net approved operational budget.

6. Allotments of €3.96 million were carried forward to 2015, which consists of uncommitted allotments and the unliquidated obligations at the end of 2014.

7. At the beginning of 2015, an additional €14.6 million were allotted. This level is equivalent to 87 per cent of estimates included in the approved programme and budgets when all budget categories are considered. Allotments for staff costs have been released on the basis of staff on board. Further allotments in the amount of €0.6 million were issued in 2015 for non-staff expenditures.

8. Operational budget expenditures amounted to €18.5 million on 31 March 2015. In the preceding biennium similar expenditures amounted to €16.4 million as at 31 March 2013.

9. Technical cooperation activities in 2014 reached a level of US\$ 171.2 million, including obligations. Income from support costs and other miscellaneous sources in 2014 amounted to €12.5 million. During the first quarter of 2015, technical cooperation project delivery reached US\$ 63.1 million, including obligations.

C. Buildings management

10. An allotment of €21.6 million net of carried forward amounts was issued in 2014 with an additional amount of €25.7 million in 2015. The buildings management budget is being implemented in accordance with the prevailing workplan.

11. Expenditures as at 31 March 2015 amounted to €33.3 million, compared to €35.0 million in 2013. This amount represents 60.5 per cent of the buildings management gross expenditure biennial budget.

III. Assessed contributions

A. Collections

12. A total of forty-four Member States, including six least developed countries (LDCs), have made full payments. Twenty-one Member States, four of which are LDCs, have made partial payments and/or their adjustments have been credited towards their assessed contributions for the year 2015. The collections in the period from January to March 2015, broken down by List of States, are shown in table 1.

B. Outstanding contributions

13. The detailed status of assessed contributions outstanding as at 31 March 2015 is contained in the annex to the present document. The scale of assessments and outstanding contributions as of the same period, broken down by List of States, are shown in table 2.

IV. Voting rights

14. As indicated in the annex to the present document, the voting rights of forty-seven Member States had been suspended as at 31 March 2015, in accordance with Article 5.2 of the Constitution and financial regulation 5.5 (b). In comparison, the voting rights of forty-two countries had been suspended at the same time last year. The status of voting rights in respect of the various policymaking organs is shown in table 3.

15. In order to restore their voting rights for 2015, these Member States must pay their full contributions for 2012 and prior years, including advances to the Working Capital Fund, as well as a partial contribution for 2013. The minimum total amount that would have to be paid by these Member States is €6,519,610.

V. Multi-year payment plans

16. Table 4 shows, in summary form, the current status of those Member States that have entered into payment plan arrangements to settle outstanding assessed contributions. The Secretariat notes with appreciation and recognizes the considerable efforts made by all those Member States that have honoured their commitments and obligations as stipulated in their respective payment plans. Other Member States in arrears are encouraged to consider submitting payment plans to steadily reduce their outstanding assessed contributions.

VI. Arrears by former Member States

17. The amount of arrears owed to UNIDO by the United States of America is €69,068,887 (1994-1996), while the arrears of the former Yugoslavia amount to €2,081,599 (1990-2001). Payment of these arrears is being pursued by the Secretariat.

VII. Unutilized balances of appropriations

18. In accordance with the General Conference decision GC.15/Dec.13, unutilized balances of appropriations, a total amount of €942,896 was made available for the special account to retain office space for the biennium 2014-2015. As at 31 December 2014, the entire amount has been utilized by maintenance expenditures of the Common Buildings Management services, including a proportionate share of Safety and Security service charges for the two floors.

VIII. Action required of the Committee

19. The Committee may wish to consider recommending to the Board the adoption of the following draft decision:

“The Industrial Development Board:

(a) Takes note of the information provided in document IDB.43/4-PBC.31/4;

(b) Urges those Member States and former Member States that have not yet paid their assessed contributions, including advances to the Working Capital Fund and prior years' arrears, to do so without delay;

(c) Requests the Director General to pursue his efforts and contacts with Member States and former Member States to effect the collection of arrears;

(d) Requests the Director General to continue his efforts to ensure that current Member States sustain their support to the Organization.”
